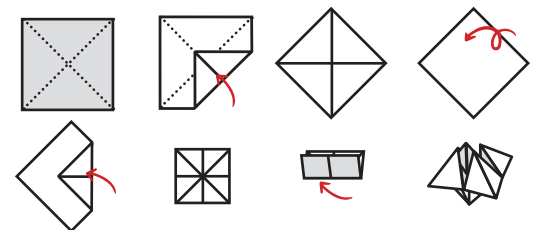


Using the Waste Wise Chatterbox

1. Ask someone to pick a word that's written on one of the square pockets
2. Open and close the chatterbox by spelling out the word
3. Ask them to choose one of the numbers written inside, then open and close the chatterbox by counting out the chosen number
4. Ask them to pick another number, then open it and read the question.

Making a Chatterbox

1. Place the paper face-up
2. Carefully cut the square template out of this sheet
3. Fold the square sheet you have in half to make a rectangle
4. Fold the rectangle in half to make a smaller square
5. Unfold it all and lay it so the blank side is face up
6. Fold each corner into the centre
7. Turn the sheet over and fold each corner into the centre
8. Fold this new square in half
9. Slip your fingers under the paper tongues on the outside edges — and pinch or pull — the Chatterbox will begin to take shape as you do.
